We had a great turn out with 88 groups in attendance from as far and wide as Allihies, Kanturk and Youghal. All of our 18 governance policies and workplan were discussed and ratified by an overwhelming majority of 98%. - 7. Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD. has today announced €3.5 million in funding to support 189 outdoor projects across the country. The funding, under the Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS), will further enhance our unique natural amenities and support Rural Ireland as a destination for adventure tourism. The scheme is designed to support the enhancement of dozens of recreational amenities such as our mountain trails, forest walks, beaches, rivers, lakes, blueways and greenways. Link

in the allocation of a portion of a public budget Collaboration for Change (CfC) and partners are delighted to announce the launch of Join the Dots Participatory Budgeting (PB) around the theme of **creating connections**. CfC is a collective of organisations and individual

activists who are working alongside each other for the Common Good. We work to create open spaces for shared learning, peer support, practical hope and collaboration. Individuals and Groups can bid for up to £500 (or Euro equivalent) under the theme of 'Creating Connections' this could be for example, with people,

nature, environment, communities, sports, young and old, food, heritage

etc. Anyone aged 8+ can get involved. It's a very simple bid form along with a short 2 min video (captured on a mobile phone/ camera) pitching the idea. The deadline has been extended
