
It's going to be a very proud day for their Village.

#fundingfriday LIDL GREEN FUND OPENS FOR APPLICATIONS

The Lidl Green Fund is a new community sustainability initiative from Lidl Ireland. The Green Fund aims to support, promote and empower environmentally conscious and healthy local community projects across the Republic of Ireland.

Lidl has created this €100,000 fund to support communities take an active role in championing sustainable living.

Community groups, schools and charities across the country can apply for funding through the application portal. Shortlisted groups are selected per county by Lidl employees and independent judges and the winners are selected by publicly nominated voting in Lidl stores through the Lidl Plus App.

Community groups, primary and post primary schools and charities must **complete the online application form here**. This is the Application for the Lidl Green Fund Republic of Ireland.

EirGrid announces opening of next phase of €2.4m community benefit fund

EirGrid, the operator and developer of Ireland's electricity grid has announced the opening of the next phase of community benefit sharing for the Celtic Interconnector project. Applications for the second phase of the €2.4 million fund are now being welcomed, with €841,013 in funding available to eligible communities and voluntary groups.

The Celtic Interconnector Community Benefit Fund was established by EirGrid to recognise the importance of local communities who facilitate this critical development of the electricity grid and will benefit groups and projects in the east Cork project area.

The Celtic Interconnector, a 575km subsea link between Ireland and France, will enable the movement of electricity between the two countries, making our electricity supply more secure. The community benefit fund is open to community groups and not-for-profit organisations who can demonstrate benefits to communities from the services, programmes or facilities they provide in the project area, under three streams of funding: community, sustainability and biodiversity.

Funding of €240,000 will be available for community projects, €240,000 for sustainability projects and €361,013 for biodiversity projects, with a €121,013 underspend carried over from the first phase of the fund under the biodiversity stream.

The first phase of the Celtic Interconnector Community Benefit Fund saw 29 community groups receive a total of €838,987, with funding supporting a wide range of projects, from the funding of an electric vehicle community bus, the funding of LED floodlights for Youghal Rugby Football Club, to supporting the development of a school's sensory garden.

Speaking about the fund opening, Sinead Dooley, Head of Public Engagement, EirGrid said: "We're delighted to open the next phase of this fund and build on the incredible projects already completed. These initiatives demonstrate the power of collaboration and show how targeted support can make a real difference. We strongly encourage communities to apply, particularly for projects with a biodiversity focus."

Dooley added, "This fund shows EirGrid's commitment to supporting local communities as they further environmental sustainability and civic initiatives. We want to thank all the communities in east Cork who have collaborated with us so far as we work to deliver this strategic energy project and we look forward to seeing what can be achieved through this latest phase of funding."

2025 CHILDMINDING DEVELOPMENT GRANT OPENS FOR APPLICATIONS

The Childminding Development Grant provides up to €1,000 to assist both registered and unregistered childminders who are providing a childminding service in their own homes.

Applications for the 2025 Childminding Development Grant open on Tuesday, 4 February and close on Friday, 4 April.

The grant aims to support childminders to enhance quality and safety in their service through the purchase of toys, childcare equipment, safety equipment, equipment to support inclusion and Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Maths (STEAM) education, as well as IT equipment to assist childminders to engage with training and registration processes.

The grant scheme is open to all childminders, including those who are planning to open a childminding business during 2025. 75% of the grant is paid in advance to help childminders with the upfront costs of purchasing equipment.

Making today's announcement, Norma Foley, Minister for Children, Disability and Equality said:

"I am delighted to announce the launch of the 2025 Childminding Development Grant as one of the first actions in my term of office as Minister.

"Childminders play an essential part in the provision of childcare in all parts of the country, and I am fully committed to recognizing and supporting their important role, and to following through on the National Action Plan for Childminding 2021-2028. "I encourage childminders to avail of this funding opportunity, whether they are already registered or would like support in advance of registration over the next couple of years. "The Childminding Development Grant provides funding for quality and safety equipment and can also be used to contribute to IT equipment."

The total budget of €500,000 reflects the high demand for the grant in previous years. It also reflects the Government's commitment to support childminders to prepare for registration with Tusla. In line with the National Action Plan for Childminding 2021-2028, regulations written specifically for childminders came into effect for the first time



in September 2024, making it possible for all childminders to register with Tusla and take part in the National Childcare Scheme (NCS).

Those childminders who were previously exempt from regulation have a three-year transition period until 2027 during which they are now able to register with Tusla but are not yet required to do so.
