

Linkage Groups

Linkage Groups bring together stakeholder organisations and groups who are members of the PPN with a common interest to discuss their diverse views and interests in a specific policy area.

This is a pathway for such organisations and groups to have a real input into policy in their respective area of operation.

Linkage Groups are an essential component of the work of the PPN.

They are independent networks of community groups who are interested in a common theme such as Arts, Community, Environment, Heritage, Housing, Planning, Social Inclusion, Transport or Tourism (and more).

Linkage Groups work to influence change. They do this through advocating for policy changes on behalf of the community through PPN Reps engaging with Cork County Council and other bodies appropriate to the issue or subject matter of advocacy.

After our recent Plenary meeting, we are proposing four Linkage Groups:

- 1. Housing, Planning, Transport and Community Safety
- 2. Arts, Community, Heritage and Tourism
- 3. Climate Change, Water and Environment
- 4. Social Inclusion, Rural Development, Youth, Enterprise & Recreation

By making submissions to a Linkage Group, you can support our SPC and LCDC Reps and give them a mandate to bring to the Council.



Get involved! Secretariat Vacancies:

Cork County PPN has a number of vacancies available, some on the various Committees within the County Council - the SPCs and LDCDs, but at the moment we also have a number of positions we are looking to fill on our Secretariat - the incredibly important group that keeps the PPN show on the road !

The Cork County PPN Secretariat provides a coordinating and oversight function for the PPN. Its role is to:

- Facilitate the implementation of decisions of the PPN
- Ensure the proper functioning of the PPN between plenary meetings
- Coordinate the activities of the PPN Communicate extensively and regularly with all PPN members and disseminate information concerning all PPN activities as widely as possible
- Manage and support PPN staff The Secretariat is made up of two representatives from each of the Cork County Municipal Districts i.e. Carrigaline, Macroom, Cobh, East Cork, Bandon-Kinsale, Fermoy, Kanturk-Mallow and West Cork, as well as, two representatives from each of the PPN colleges i.e. Community & Voluntary College, Social Inclusion College and Environmental College.

Commitment Involved:

The Secretariat role is voluntary and requires approximately two hours per month to attend meetings, which generally take place at 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of each month, alternating between in-person and online formats. Travel expenses for in-person meetings are reimbursed. Additional involvement may be required from time to time, such as participation in sub-groups or events.

This is a rewarding opportunity for individuals to contribute meaningfully to the social fabric of our communities. Secretariat members receive access to training and national events, develop key skills, and play a crucial role in shaping supports for community groups, particularly those representing marginalised voices.

AIB COMMUNITY €1 MILLION FUND 2025 NOW ACCEPTING NOMINATIONS

The AIB Community €1 Million Fund is back for 2025!

The AIB Community €1 Million Fund enables customers, the public and our employees to support the local charities that matter most to them, within their region. The Fund supports charities across six regions in Ireland, Northern Ireland & Great Britain.

AIB will once again allocate €700,000 to charities chosen by its customers and the community, while €300,000 will be donated to charities chosen by employees.

The 2025 AIB Community €1 Million Fund will open for nominations from 14 May for six weeks, closing on 25 June.

An Roinn Forbartha Tuaithe agus Pobail Department of Rural and Community Development Minister Buttimer Announces Funding Call for Pilot Place-Based Philanthropy projects

- €600,000 fund available over three years for pilot place-based philanthropy projects.
- A key objective of the National Philanthropy Policy 2024-2028 to promote Government and sectoral partnership.
- Supporting community led projects that test innovative, co-funding approaches to addressing local issues.

Minister of State for Rural and Community Development, Jerry Buttimer, today (Thursday, 15th May) announced a funding call for pilot place-based philanthropy projects.

This call is focussed on local projects that bring together community and philanthropic resources in a collaborative way to address key social issues. Funding will be provided on a 50:50 match funding basis, with up to €50,000 per annum available over three years for successful projects.

This call is a key action under the <u>National Philanthropy Policy for Ireland 2024-</u> <u>2028</u> aimed at promoting Government and philanthropic collaboration.

The call will provide funding to co-funded projects that address a local need or challenge, have a confirmed philanthropic partner and are able to demonstrate strong community involvement, cross sector collaboration and sustainable outcomes.

Minister Buttimer said:

"I am very pleased to launch this call for pilot place-based philanthropy projects. The Programme for Government affirms the Government's commitment to progressing the National Philanthropy Policy which is aimed at growing philanthropy in Ireland.

"The Policy sets a clear vision – to create an environment that supports philanthropy and maximises its impact for the public good.

"And place-based giving is a major driver for philanthropists to give back to their local communities.




"This call for pilot projects is a first step towards developing a framework for greater partnership and collaboration between government – both local government and national government - and the philanthropic community."

Applications to this call must be led by a community development organisation or community- based group that has a confirmed philanthropic funding partner. Consultation and engagement with the relevant local authority will also be taken into consideration when assessing applications.
