<u>Statement from Cork County PPN on New Local Authority Tidy Towns Insurance</u> Scheme

We acknowledge the new Local Authority Tidy Towns Insurance Scheme, a national initiative underwritten by IPB and supported by Cork County Council, effective from 1st April 2025, which requires Tidy Towns groups to be registered with the Public Participation Network (PPN) for coverage. Although Cork County PPN were not consulted about this initiative prior to it being announced we welcome it as we believe it is a good initiative for our member groups.

We understand that Cork County Council has issued correspondence to some Tidy Towns groups saying that the insurance scheme is designed to support and protect everyone involved, committees, volunteers, and the Council alike, but in reality the situation has created significant challenges for Tidy Towns groups seeking insurance, and we have received several queries from Tidy Towns groups and many Local Councillors.

Key Information for Tidy Towns Groups:

- Existing PPN Members: You can check if you are registered with Cork County PPN

- If your group is already registered with Cork County PPN, no further action is needed with the PPN for insurance purposes. i.e. you do not have to contact us or re-register with us.
- New Registrations: You can register with Cork County PPN here https://corkcountyppn.ie/join/. Please note that new PPN registrations can take
 approximately 6 weeks. We cannot expedite this process, and whilst we did offer,
 IPB has advised that letters confirming in-progress registrations cannot be
 accepted for immediate insurance coverage.
