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

WATER SAFETY GUIDELINES FOR WINTER DIPS







Know before you Go...

Check local tides and weather.

Choose a body of water appropriate for your level.

Do not go out of your depth and swim parallel to shore.

Never swim alone – find a local swimming group or swim with friends and family.

Have a safety plan with fellow swimmers in case of emergency.

In an emergency call 999 or 112 and ask for the Coast Guard.

Read safety signage and water safety notice boards.

Make sure you are Visible -wear a brightly coloured swim hat & tow float

Gradually build the amount of time you spend in the water up – Listen to your body & do not get too cold!

Warm up as soon as you get out of the water – keep moving. Bring a warm drink, warm clothes.



Cold Water Shock & Hypothermia
Symptoms of Hyperthermia
Fumbles- dropping things due to loss of
fine motor skills & grip strength
Grumbles- negative outlook & shivering
Mumbles- mental confusion & slurring
Stumbles- loss of coordination & muscle
function.

Tips for entering cold water:

Enter the water slowly

Focus on the breath, take slow long and deep breaths, in and out the nose.

Scooping the water up and tipping it onto our forehead and neck- allows us to acclimatise and activates the mammalian dive reflex which slows breathing. More information available: https://watersafety.ie/wintersafety/

Get involved! Join Our Linkage Groups!

Linkage Groups bring together stakeholder organisations and groups who are members of the PPN with a common interest to discuss their diverse views and interests in a specific policy area.

This is a pathway for such organisations and groups to have a real input into policy in their respective area of operation.

Linkage Groups are an essential component of the work of the PPN.

They are independent networks of community groups who are interested in a common theme such as Arts, Community, Environment, Heritage, Housing, Planning, Social Inclusion, Transport or Tourism (and more).

Linkage Groups work to influence change. They do this through advocating for policy changes on behalf of the community through PPN Reps engaging with Cork County Council and other bodies appropriate to the issue or subject matter of advocacy.

After our recent Plenary meeting, we are proposing four Linkage Groups:

- 1. Housing, Planning, Transport and Community Safety
- 2. Arts, Community, Heritage and Tourism
- 3. Climate Change, Water and Environment
- 4. Social Inclusion, Rural Development, Youth, Enterprise & Recreation

By making submissions to a Linkage Group, you can support our SPC and LCDC Reps and give them a mandate to bring to the Council.



Secretariat Vacancies:

Cork County PPN has a number of vacancies available, some on the various Committees within the County Council - the SPCs and LDCDs, but at the moment we also have a number of positions we are looking to fill on our Secretariat - the incredibly important group that keeps the PPN show on the road!

The Cork County PPN Secretariat provides a coordinating and oversight function for the PPN. Its role is to:

- Facilitate the implementation of decisions of the PPN
- Ensure the proper functioning of the PPN between plenary meetings
- Coordinate the activities of the PPN Communicate extensively and regularly with all PPN members and disseminate information concerning all PPN activities as widely as possible
- Manage and support PPN staff The Secretariat is made up of two representatives from each of the Cork County Municipal Districts i.e. Carrigaline, Macroom, Cobh, East Cork, Bandon-Kinsale, Fermoy, Kanturk-Mallow and West Cork, as well as, two representatives from each of the PPN colleges i.e. Community & Voluntary College, Social Inclusion College and Environmental College.

Commitment Involved:

The Secretariat role is voluntary and requires approximately two hours per month to attend meetings, which generally take place at 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of each month, alternating between in-person and online formats. Travel expenses for in-person meetings are reimbursed. Additional involvement may be required from time to time, such as participation in sub-groups or events.

This is a rewarding opportunity for individuals to contribute meaningfully to the social fabric of our communities. Secretariat members receive access to training and national events, develop key skills, and play a crucial role in shaping supports for community groups, particularly those representing marginalised voices.

Community Climate Action Programme, Strand 1 Call 2

Cork County Council is delighted to announce that applications will open for the **Community Climate Action Programme (CCAP) Strand 1, Call 2** on **Tuesday 28**th **October 2025** for a period of **8 weeks,** with a closing date of **Tuesday 23**rd **December 2025**. Applications can be made through <u>YourCouncil.ie</u>.

This Programme will provide targeted funding to community groups through a competitive application process to deliver community climate action.

The Community Climate Action Programme (CCAP) in partnership with Cork County Council, aims to support and empower communities to shape and build low carbon, sustainable communities to contribute to national climate and energy targets.

Strand 1, Call 2 of the CCAP will provide funding to community organisations in Cork County to deliver a local climate action project or initiative, and eligible community organisations can apply for up to 100% funding across three categories:

Small scale projects: Up to €20,000

Medium scale projects: €20,000 to €50,000

Large scale projects: €51,000 to €100,000

Proposed projects should address one or more of the following five themes:

- community energy
- travel
- food and waste
- shopping and recycling
- local climate and environmental action.

Cork County Council has, once again, been allocated €1.24 million by the Department of Climate, Energy & the Environment to deliver the second call of the CCAP.

Cork County Council are hosting eight in-person project clinics at the following locations:

Macroom Library Wednesday 29th October 11am - 1pm
Carrigaline Library Wednesday 29th October 3pm - 5pm
Mallow Library Thursday 30th October 11am - 1pm
Midleton Library Tuesday 4th November 3pm - 5pm



Skibbereen Library Wednesday 5th November 11am – 1pm
Bandon Library Wednesday 5th November 3pm – 5pm
Fermoy Library Thursday 6th November 11am – 1pm
Cobh Library Thursday 6th November 3pm - 5pm

These project clinics will provide an opportunity for prospective applicants to discuss the CCAP and their proposed project on a one-to-one basis.

PARENT PEER SUPPORT FUND NOW OPEN

The Minister for Children, Disability and Equality, Norma Foley, has announced that a €150,000 parent peer support fund is now open for applications.

Parent peer support is when parents support each other by sharing knowledge, reducing feelings of isolation, and providing encouragement to navigate challenges and achieve well-being.

Grants of up to €5,000 can be provided to organisations working with parents and/or carers to support them to develop parent peer support initiatives. This includes peer support for parents who share similar life experiences, such as raising a child with complex needs or a mental health condition.

The Parent Peer Support fund will be made available under two tiers of funding.

- Tier 1 will provide grants of €2,500 to 37 successful applicants who either currently operate or wish to establish a new parent peer support project.
- Tier 2 will provide grants of €5,000 to 12 successful applicants who wish to scale up an existing parent peer support project, which is already having a positive impact on parents.

RURAL ACTION AWARDS FOR 2025/2026 OPENS FOR APPLICATIONS

For the 4th year running, the Rural Action Awards Scheme 2025/26 is currently open for applications and will randomly select 4 successful recipients after the current **closing date of 20 November 2025**.

The Rural Action Awards Scheme is aimed at supporting rural communities celebrate their own achievements:

- Rural community-based organisations in Northern Ireland, or the border region of Ireland have the opportunity to apply for and be in with a chance of securing £1000 or €1000 towards their chosen community project
- The scheme is open to constituted rural community-based organisations including charities, not for profit community groups, sporting and cultural organisations, heritage groups, Parent Teacher Associations, youth groups/clubs and social enterprises
- 4 recipients chosen at random for this call
- Simple application form and verification process with evidence of constitution and bank account in group name required if successful
- The scheme seeks to support practical, tangible and timebound projects where the project must complete within 12 weeks
- The scheme is open for applications now and will close on 20th November 2025.

Critical Research on the Challenges Facing the Community Sector



For many years, PPNs have heard and witnessed the growing pressures on the community and voluntary sector. The network has consistently advocated on behalf of the sector, but success has been limited - in part due to a lack of solid evidence with regard to the direct impact of these challenges on the operation of community organisations.

Under the Power to Change initiative, Sligo PPN have partnered with Atlantic Technological University to undertake a piece of research to form a solid evidence base on the key challenges facing the sector and what this means to grass roots community activity and volunteering.



This survey aims to:

- collect the evidence needed to highlight and stress to Government the challenges faced by community groups,
- to demonstrate that additional and better coordinated supports are needed for groups to operate successfully and thrive.

More and more is being asked of the community sector, including taking a leading role on climate action. What support does the community sector need to make this workable?

The survey was co-designed with community organisations as well as colleagues across the PPN network.

While led by Sligo PPN and ATU under the Power to Change initiative, this research is intended to be of benefit to the entire PPN network and the broader community sector.

The survey will go out across the entire PPN national network as well as other key community based networks. The more feedback we receive, the stronger our case will be for advocating for positive change in the sector.

Shaping the New National Volunteering Strategy



Public Consultation to inform Ireland's Social Climate Plan

The Department of Climate, Energy and the Environment (DCEE) is currently developing a national Social Climate Plan which will set out measures to be financed from the EU Social Climate Fund over the period 2026 to 2032.

We are writing to you to draw your attention to a public consultation to inform the development of this Plan. The consultation was launched by Minister Darragh O'Brien on 11 September that will conclude on 23 October.

The EU Social Climate Fund is the first EU fund developed with the explicit purpose of alleviating potential energy and transport poverty occurring from the transition towards clean mobility and a decarbonised built environment. The focus of Ireland's Plan will be investment in long-lasting, socially fair measures aimed at supporting those who may be most vulnerable to energy and transport poverty arising from the rise in the price of carbon and consequent rise in fossil fuel prices.

DCEE is working closely with relevant Departmental stakeholders and with the European Commission to ensure that the Plan developed will meet the requirements of the governing Regulation. We are committed to developing robust and high-quality measures, guided by meaningful stakeholder input, to ensure that the funds are appropriately targeted to those most vulnerable. In this context, two consultation processes at key points in the development of the Plan are planned.

The first of those is the following open public and stakeholder consultation which is designed to capture information on what the public and stakeholders see as the priorities for investment under this Plan. The second consultation, being planned for November, will be a public event, with European Commission officials present.

Commenting on the consultation, Minister O'Brien said:

"Over the longer-term, we will have a much more sustainable, secure and efficient transport and heating system, but in the here and now, I recognise that the transition can be difficult for people and that it impacts people unevenly. We have a fantastic opportunity now, with the support of this significant EU co-financing, to develop measures that will have a lasting impact on the wellbeing and comfort of those most vulnerable to energy and transport poverty while also having decarbonisation cobenefits.

While this is an open consultation, I particularly encourage all those impacted by energy and transport poverty, and the groups that represent them, to participate in this consultation."

Ollscoil Chathair Bhaile Átha Cliath Dublin City University

We'd like to invite you to take part in a <u>short survey</u> (5–10 minutes) being carried out by researchers at Dublin City University.

The study looks at how false or misleading information (misinformation and disinformation) is affecting Ireland's voluntary and community sector – especially charities and organisations working on issues such as gender, race, and migration.

The survey covers:

- What kinds of false stories or harmful narratives are targeting the sector
- How these impact organisations' ability to do their work
- What supports or resources could help groups respond more effectively.

All responses will be anonymous. The findings will be published in a report early next year to highlight the impact of misinformation on our sector.
