### Deposit Return Scheme Pilot on the Islands



**Re-turn**, the operator of Ireland's Deposit Return Scheme, has expanded access to its reverse vending machines (RVMs) and recycling infrastructure to three island communities in Ireland. The pilot will see the installation of RVMs on Cape Clear Island in Co. Cork and Arranmore Island in Co. Donegal as well as communal Re-turn collection bins on Inishturk, Co. Mayo, ensuring residents and visitors alike can easily return drinks containers for recycling.

The Islands Pilot Programme will gather information and data, monitoring return rates, machine usage patterns and community feedback to inform wider rollouts of RVMs to island communities in the future.

Island communities face unique challenges in managing waste, including limited transport links and constrained local infrastructure. Providing convenient return points ensures these communities are not disadvantaged in participating in the Deposit Return Scheme and supports equal access to recycling services across Ireland.

## **Water Safety Appeal for St. Brigid's Bank Holiday Weekend 2026**

### **St Brigid's Bank holiday weekend water safety appeal from Irish Coast Guard, RNLI and Water Safety Ireland**

**Following a period of poor weather, storms and heavy rainfall, the Irish Coast Guard, Water Safety Ireland and the RNLI are reminding the public that checking weather and sea conditions is a critical first step before any coastal or water-based activity. Strong winds this weekend are expected to lead to very rough sea states and large swells, making coastal conditions particularly dangerous.**

Storm waters and rising sea levels can quickly cut people off from safety or allow waves to reach places that are normally dry, leaving little or no time to escape. Keeping safe around water is everyone's responsibility and staying back from the water's edge can prevent a tragedy.

Remember too that the edges of waterside pathways may have been damaged in storms and may be unstable.

Year-round swimming and dipping are increasingly popular. Wind conditions can affect waves and swell, create rip currents and poor visibility, and increase cold exposure. Strong winds make open water riskier, even if the sky is clear. Because water conditions can shift quickly, a calm morning can turn dangerous by afternoon. If the water looks rough, murky, or unpredictable, it may not be safe to enter, so err on the side of caution and do not get in.

#### **If swimming at this time of year, remember:**

- Water temperatures are still cold - wear a wetsuit, brightly coloured swimming cap, and gloves to stay warm**
- Acclimatise slowly and use a tow float to increase visibility.**
- Never swim alone and always ensure that a colleague is monitoring your activity.**

For the most up to date information on weather and conditions, always check local forecasts to keep informed. If you see somebody in trouble on the water or along the coast or think they are in trouble; Dial 112 or 999 or use VHF radio CH 16 and ask for the Coast Guard.

### Secretariat Vacancies:

Cork County PPN has a number of vacancies available, some on the various Committees within the County Council - the SPCs and LCDs, but at the moment we also have a number of positions we are looking to fill on our Secretariat - the incredibly important group that keeps the PPN show on the road !

The Cork County PPN Secretariat provides a coordinating and oversight function for the PPN. Its role is to:

- Facilitate the implementation of decisions of the PPN
- Ensure the proper functioning of the PPN between plenary meetings
- Coordinate the activities of the PPN Communicate extensively and regularly with all PPN members and disseminate information concerning all PPN activities as widely as possible
- Manage and support PPN staff The Secretariat is made up of two representatives from each of the Cork County Municipal Districts i.e. Carrigaline, Macroom, Cobh, East Cork, Bandon-Kinsale, Fermoy, Kanturk-Mallow and West Cork, as well as, two representatives from each of the PPN colleges i.e. Community & Voluntary College, Social Inclusion College and Environmental College.

#### Commitment Involved:

The Secretariat role is voluntary and requires approximately two hours per month to attend meetings, which generally take place at 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of each month, alternating between in-person and online formats. Travel expenses for in-person meetings are reimbursed. Additional involvement may be required from time to time, such as participation in sub-groups or events.

This is a rewarding opportunity for individuals to contribute meaningfully to the social fabric of our communities. Secretariat members receive access to training and national events, develop key skills, and play a crucial role in shaping supports for community groups, particularly those representing marginalised voices.



## Cork County Council Launches Enhanced Local Festival & Event Fund 2026

Cork County Council is delighted to announce the launch of the Local Festival & Event Fund 2026, a key investment in Cork County's cultural and tourism landscape. The fund is supported by Fáilte Ireland, reflecting a shared commitment to developing high-quality festivals and events across Cork County.

This enhanced initiative is designed to strengthen communities, support economic growth, and position Cork County as a leading destination for visitors throughout the year.

The Local Festival & Event Fund 2026 is delivered through two distinct funding strands:

#### **Strand A - Small/Medium Festivals & Events**

Designed to strengthen local identity and attract domestic visitors, with grants of up to €6,000 available.

#### **Eligibility:**

- Event must take place within Cork County
- Minimum 150 projected bed nights
- Minimum €7,500 total expenditure
- High-quality programme with strong domestic tourism relevance

### **Strand B - Large-Scale Festivals & Events**

Targeting major events that deliver significant economic impact and elevate Cork County's profile nationally and internationally.

#### **Eligibility:**

- Event must take place within Cork County
- Minimum 1,000 projected bed nights
- Minimum €20,000 expenditure
- Professionally structured, high-calibre programme

Both strands will be assessed on programme quality, marketing and collaboration, delivery capacity, seasonality, visitor experience fit, and sustainability practices.

Welcoming the launch, Mayor of the County of Cork, Councillor Mary Linehan Foley, said:

*“Festivals and events are a central part of Cork County’s visitor economy and of what makes the county a strong and distinctive destination. They support local enterprise, sustain employment, and generate economic activity that benefits towns and villages across the county. Cork County Council is taking a strategic approach to supporting festivals and events that are well planned, professionally delivered, and deliver clear value for communities and the wider economy. This enhanced fund supports a sustainable festivals and events sector that strengthens Cork County’s tourism offering and helps to extend the tourism season across the year.”*

# Public Consultation on the Draft Cork Wastewater Strategy and associated Environmental Reports

**Uisce Éireann** has commenced an 8-week public consultation on the draft Cork Wastewater Strategy and associated environmental reports.

The Draft Strategy sets out a long-term plan for managing wastewater services across the **Cork Metropolitan Area**, assessing existing infrastructure and identifying the future investment required to support sustainable growth, environmental protection, and climate resilience through to **2030, 2055 and 2080**.

Uisce Éireann will be consulting with a wide range of environmental and public bodies to progress this comprehensive assessment of all existing wastewater infrastructure and set out a vision for future development. Members of the public and all interested stakeholders are also invited to participate in the consultation and make a submission.

**Submissions are invited from all interested parties for eight weeks from 22 January to 19 March 2026.**

This is an important project for the people of Cork, the first of its kind undertaken. Uisce Éireann is proactively looking ahead to identify the needs of the area, and the community, as far forward as 2080.

In developing the draft Cork Wastewater Strategy, Uisce Éireann has prepared key environmental reports including a Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) Natura Impact Statement (NIS).
