Home Energy Upgrade Event – Cork



Homeowners, residents, and members of the local community are invited to attend an upcoming Home Energy Upgrade Event, hosted by Energywise Ireland in partnership with SEAI.

Guests on the day include representatives from SEAI, Daikin, Cork Energy Consultancy and more.

Taking place on **Friday, 18th April from 10:00am to 3:00pm** at **Energywise Ireland HQ, Hollymount Industrial Estate, Blarney Road, Cork, T23 NA44**, the event will provide practical guidance on home energy upgrades, available grants, eligible works, and how to get started on your journey to a warmer, more energy-efficient home.

This event is ideal for homeowners interested in reducing energy costs, improving home comfort, and taking meaningful action on climate change.

As well as expert talks on the day, there will be **family-friendly activities** including the chance to play basketball with Cork's own Neptune Basketball players, and guests will have the opportunity to test drive an electric vehicle.

All attendees will also receive €100 off a Home Energy Assessment - the first step in the One Stop Shop process. A Home Energy Assessment shows how energy-efficient your home currently is and highlights the upgrades that will make it more efficient.



Why attend this event?



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Join us to learn how to take action for nature in your community. Humans have the power to shape their landscape for better or worse, creating or destroying habitats that support the wildlife around us and support our own survival.

Through local collective action we can make a huge difference to our eco-system that we rely on for clean air, fresh water, high quality food, and our physical and mental health. How can we live side by side with our wild neighbours so that we can all thrive? Find out at our launch event for National Biodiversity Week!

What will the day include?

Learn how to create a plan of action and explore ideas for your own community with a workshop on creating a Biodiversity Action Plan led by ecologist Karen Loxton.

Hear from a local group, Green Skibbereen, who has the experience of creating their own plan. They will showcase their own actions and ideas that can be applied to other areas. In addition we will hear of their work as the Irish partners for the Forestcarbovision project.

Discover how to identify and catalogue the wildlife in your area through Citizen Science initiatives. We are joined by Rachel Hayden of the National Biodiversity Data Centre who will show us how to record wildlife and help us in the field later in the day.

Open to projects of all sizes, the Awards aim to highlight real, on-the-ground action while providing a platform to share stories that inspire wider change.

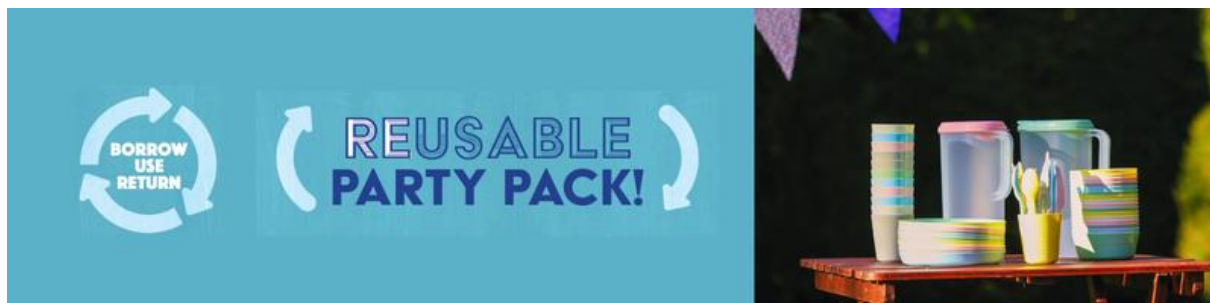
Nominations are now open until 25 May, with the Awards Ceremony taking place on 2 July at Powerscourt Estate.

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“Borrow, Use, Return” Reusable Party Pack Initiative

Communities across County Cork are set to benefit from “Borrow, Use, Return”, a reusable party-pack initiative designed to help reduce single-use plastics and support more sustainable celebrations. Cork County Council has begun distributing reusable party packs to groups across the county, including rugby, soccer and GAA clubs. The scheme is part of a wider initiative launched by Local Authorities across the Southern Waste Region to promote simple, practical circular living within communities.

Each party pack contains reusable cups, plates, cutlery, jugs and bowls. It also includes colourful bunting created by Community Reuse Network Ireland (CRNI) using upcycled textiles. All items are washable, durable and designed for repeated use within the community. The packs can support any type of gathering, from birthday parties and coffee mornings to sports celebrations and school events and can be shared among families and neighbours to maximise community benefit.

When a celebration or event is planned, residents can borrow the pack from the participating group. After the event, the items must be cleaned, dried and returned, ready for the next occasion. This cycle of borrowing, using, and returning keeps the pack in circulation, reduces reliance on single-use items and supports a circular community by keeping resources in use for longer. By cutting down on single-use catering products, the initiative also helps reduce local waste management costs.

“Borrow, Use, Return” is a collaborative project led by the 10 Local Authorities from the Southern Waste Region with funding support received through the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) National Waste Prevention Programme.

Secretariat Vacancies:

Cork County PPN has a number of vacancies available, some on the various Committees within the County Council - the SPCs and LDCDs, but at the moment we also have a number of positions we are looking to fill on our Secretariat - the incredibly important group that keeps the PPN show on the road !

The Cork County PPN Secretariat provides a coordinating and oversight function for the PPN. Its role is to:

- Facilitate the implementation of decisions of the PPN
- Ensure the proper functioning of the PPN between plenary meetings
- Coordinate the activities of the PPN Communicate extensively and regularly with all PPN members and disseminate information concerning all PPN activities as widely as possible
- Manage and support PPN staff The Secretariat is made up of two representatives from each of the Cork County Municipal Districts i.e. Carrigaline, Macroom, Cobh, East Cork, Bandon-Kinsale, Fermoy, Kanturk-Mallow and West Cork, as well as, two representatives from each of the PPN colleges i.e. Community & Voluntary College, Social Inclusion College and Environmental College.

Commitment Involved:

The Secretariat role is voluntary and requires approximately two hours per month to attend meetings, which generally take place at 7:00 PM on the third Tuesday of each month, alternating between in-person and online formats. Travel expenses for in-person meetings are reimbursed. Additional involvement may be required from time to time, such as participation in sub-groups or events.

This is a rewarding opportunity for individuals to contribute meaningfully to the social fabric of our communities. Secretariat members receive access to training and national events, develop key skills, and play a crucial role in shaping supports for community groups, particularly those representing marginalised voices.

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Join Our Linkage Groups!

Linkage Groups bring together stakeholder organisations and groups who are members of the PPN with a common interest to discuss their diverse views and interests in a specific policy area.

This is a pathway for such organisations and groups to have a real input into policy in their respective area of operation.

Linkage Groups are an essential component of the work of the PPN.

They are independent networks of community groups who are interested in a common theme such as Arts, Community, Environment, Heritage, Housing, Planning, Social Inclusion, Transport or Tourism (and more).

Linkage Groups work to influence change. They do this through advocating for policy changes on behalf of the community through PPN Reps engaging with Cork County Council and other bodies appropriate to the issue or subject matter of advocacy.

After our recent Plenary meeting, we are proposing four Linkage Groups:

1. Housing, Planning, Transport and Community Safety
2. Arts, Community, Heritage and Tourism
3. Climate Change, Water and Environment
4. Social Inclusion, Rural Development, Youth, Enterprise & Recreation

2026 Community Safety Fund (CSF)

Please note that the Minister for Justice, Home Affairs and Migration, Jim O'Callaghan has officially opened the nationwide call for applications to the **2026 Community Safety Fund (CSF)**,

The Community Safety Fund is an annual grant programme that reinvests the proceeds of crime, seized by the Criminal Assets Bureau and An Garda Síochána, back into communities. The fund supports innovative local initiatives that contribute to safer and stronger communities. Since its launch in 2022, the fund has supported 127 projects nationwide and is managed by the National Office for Community Safety.

Community safety initiatives as well as groups co-funded with local authorities, NGOs and community organisations working on issues relevant to community safety and youth justice are invited to apply. Applications may be submitted by individual organisations or consortia (minimum of two organisations), with the lead partner being a community-based, not-for-profit, social enterprise with a remit relevant to community safety and/or youth justice.. Innovative approaches will be given particular consideration. Grants range from **€20,000 to €150,000**.

Complete project applications should be submitted to the relevant Municipal Districts Office.

Complete project applications must be submitted on or before Friday 29th May 2026. Incomplete applications should be avoided and will be returned.

After evaluation of the projects, the Community, Tourism & Rural Development directorate will submit the top 16 projects (2 of which must be Gaeltacht areas) for approval to the Department.

Minister for Health launches Public Consultation on hearing care services



Minister for Health Jennifer Carroll MacNeill has launched a [public consultation](#) on hearing care services in Ireland. This consultation is a crucial element of the work of the **National Hearing Care Plan Working Group**, which is tasked with developing a holistic model of hearing care in Ireland. The consultation is examining:

- The existing level of hearing care provision in Ireland.
- Workforce planning.
- The current education structures in place to ensure an adequate number of audiology graduates are available to enter the workforce.
- The appropriate level of regulation of the audiology profession.
- Improving referral pathways and the integration between acute and community care.
- The effective linkage between public and private care to improve patient outcomes, including reductions in waiting times.

This public consultation will provide an opportunity for the public to contribute their views on their awareness of, access to, and experience of hearing care services in Ireland.

The consultation also gives service providers an opportunity to express their views on key areas of focus for the Working Group.



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The views and opinions collected will be considered and used to inform the development of the National Hearing Care Plan.

Minister Carroll MacNeill said:

“There is increasing demand on public audiology services, and this has led to substantial growth in patient waiting times. Reducing waiting list times across a range of acute and community healthcare services remains a priority for this Government.

“The Hearing Care Plan Working Group has been tasked with developing recommendations for a holistic model of care for the diagnosis and treatment of hearing difficulties in the Irish population.

“This public consultation is a great opportunity for the public to help shape the future of hearing care in Ireland and I would encourage everyone to participate and make their views known.”

The consultation will be open for four weeks – the closing date is **Friday 15 May 2026**.

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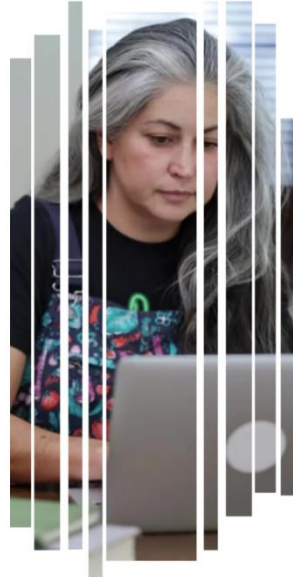
